Examination Date: Wednesday, 22 October 2025


Examination Fee: HK\$9227

2 **Application**

- 2.1 According to the regulation of the MRCP(UK) Central Office, with effect from 2024, candidates sitting MRCP(UK) Part I for the first time from the 2022/01 diet onwards, will be allowed a maximum of six attempts at each part of the MRCP(UK) Diploma (Part I/Part II (Written)/PACES). Candidate who reach six attempts at any examination will be allowed to apply for an exceptional additional attempt. Only one exceptional additional attempt will be permitted.
- 2.2 Owing to limited spaces in the examination, candidates will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. Candidates who wish to apply for this examination, including both new and re-entry participants, are advised to access to the following google link to fill in the google form by 8 August 2025 (our local application deadline) for registration and vetting first:

The College will consider the arrival time/date of return emails/uploads in our "first come, first served" mechanism if we receive more applications than our allowed quota. Applications received after the closing date will not be accepted.



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2.3 Examination fee should be submitted in the form of crossed cheque marked payable to "Hong Kong College of Physicians", with the name of the candidate and the contact phone number clearly stated at the back of the cheque. The cheque should reach the College Secretariat at Room 603, Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Hong Kong, before 5:00 pm on Friday, 8 August 2025, which is our local application deadline. The cheque should be sent via double registered mail, should one wish that to be duly delivered to the College. Our College will not be responsible for loss of mails in the application process, including deliver failures due to insufficient postage fee. Failure to put down the name and contact phone number would also lead to difficulty to identify the candidate in the application procedure.

Alternatively, you can bank in the examination fee to the following bank account of the College before 5:00 pm on Friday, 8 August 2025, which our local application deadline:

You should submit a copy of the pay in slip with your name written on it. 2.4 After vetting, our College will inform eligible candidates by emails to ask them to officially apply for the Part II (Written) examination on the MRCP website. You are required to open a MyMRCP(UK) online account for such purpose. For details, you can refer to the MRCP(UK) website:

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3 Withdrawal/Refund

Candidates should notify the MRCP(UK) Central Office of their intentions to withdraw from the examination at least 48 hours before examination start time without supporting evidence. Candidates whose withdrawal request is received by this stage will be refunded 60% of the examination fee paid. Refunds will not be provided where candidates request to withdraw after this time and up to start of the examination unless evidence of exceptional circumstance is submitted.
